in women aged 16 to 65

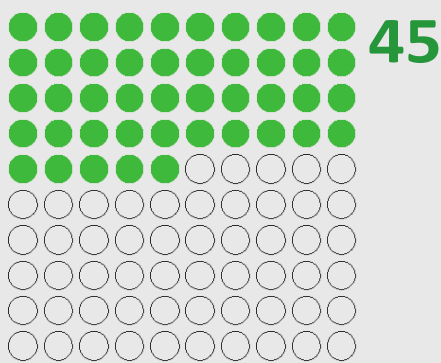
Cause and progression of a bladder infection

The cause is usually a bacterial colonization of the bladder. The symptoms may disappear spontaneously within a week.

What is a uncomplicated UTI?

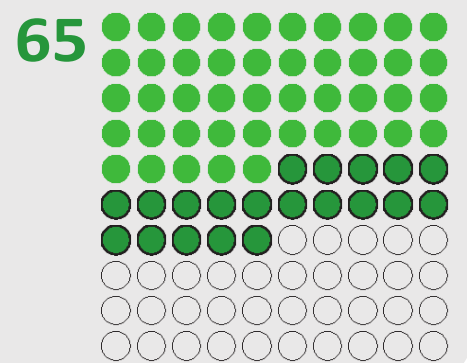
A bladder infection in non-pregnant women older than 16 and younger than 65 years of age with no relevant pre-existing illness.

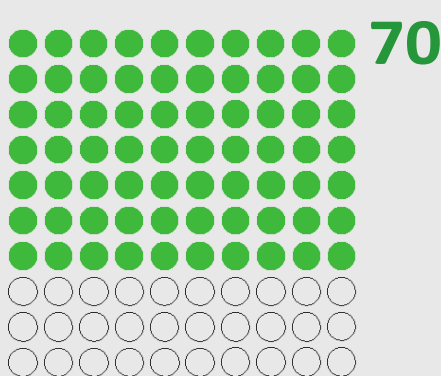


With antibiotics,

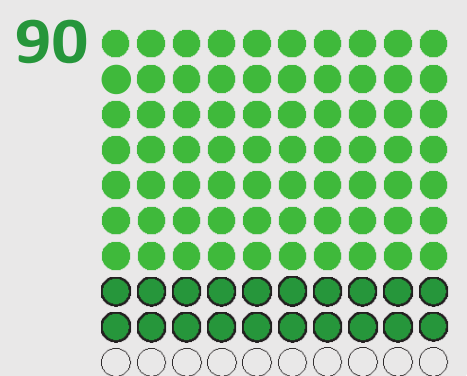

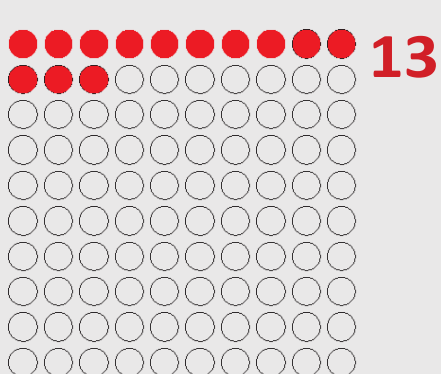


With antibiotics,
