Acute infectious cough


What causes an acute cough?

It can be caused by viruses (\geq 90%) or less often by bacteria (< 10%) and starts from an upper respiratory tract infection (common cold).

How long does an acute cough last?

The symptoms of an acute cough usually resolve within 4 weeks (average duration is 18 days).






