Acute sinusitis / rhinosinusitis


What causes an acute rhinosinusitis?

Usually caused by viruses (98-99.5%) and less commonly by bacteria (0.5-2%). Starts with an upper respiratory tract infection.

How long does acute rhinosinusitis last?

Average duration is 2-3 weeks (whether viral or bacterial). The infection usually resolves within 4 weeks.






